RA/Challengers Fall Camp Out Congress will be a fantastic Fall event at Camp Kaleo! There will be camping, the Bible & Mission Bowl, Bible Drill, RA/Challengers Track Meet, exciting worship, and tons of fun.

Cost for the Camp Out Congress is \$25.00 per person to stay in a cabin or \$20.00 per person to camp out. Price includes program fee, a limited accident insurance, breakfast and lunch. **Note: Insurance requires that a Child Protection Form MUST be completed for each group of adult chaperones — submit form with registration. Parents should also sign a Minor Photo Release Form for all State RA/Challengers events at Camp Kaleo, in the event pictures may be used for publications. (See forms on-line or in RA/Challengers Activity Packet).** Cabins are assigned on a first come, first served basis, so register early. **The deadline to register is Friday, October 29, 2010.** After the deadline there is a \$5.00 fee per person added for late registration. Fees are NONREFUNDABLE, but they can be transferred to another person from your church. Check-in begins at 5:00 PM, and the program begins at 8:30 PM. The Camp Out Congress will be dismissed on Saturday at 2:00 PM.

Upon registering, each chapter will receive 50 qualifying questions for the Bible and Mission Bowl, along with projects information. The 50 questions are to be answered and turned in at the on-site registration area on Saturday morning by 8:15 a.m. Those qualifying questions are also available on-line at www.ga-ra.org. Bible Bowl/Project details, and Track Meet rules are on-line and in the "Young Men & Boys Ministries" Handbook. Sources for the questions asked during the Bowl will be the Book of Acts and the 50 qualifying questions. There will be a Bowl for Lads, Crusaders, and Challengers.

Date & Time:

RA/Challengers Fall Campout Congress is held at Camp Kaleo each year in **November**.

For Campout Congress date, check online at www.ga-ra.org, or in the Annual RA/Challenger Activities Packet published by Men's Ministries.

Check-in begins Friday at 5:00 PM, and the Program begins Friday at 8:30 PM. The Campout Congress will be dismissed on Saturday at 2:00 PM.

Registration & Cost:

Cost for the Campout Congress is per person to campout, or to stay in a cabin. (For cost and to download Registration Form, see on-line, or the Annual Activities Packet.) Price includes program fee, a limited accident insurance, breakfast and lunch. Cabins are assigned on a first come, first served basis, so register early.

The deadline to register is Friday one week prior to the Campout Congress. After the deadline there is a \$5.00 fee per person added for late registration. Fees are NONREFUNDABLE, but they can be transferred to another person from your church.

Note: Insurance requires that a **Child Protection Form MUST** be completed for each "group" of adult chaperones. Submit form with registration. A **Minor Photo Release** signed by parents is also requested, in the event pictures may be used in publications. (See forms on-line, or in the Annual Activities Packet published by Men's Ministries.)

Details:

Fall Campout Congress has camping, the Bible & Mission Bowl, Bible Drill, RA/Challengers Track Meet, exciting worship, and tons of fun.

After registering, each Chapter will receive 50 qualifying questions for the Bible and Mission Bowl, and the information for projects. (Congress activities can be subject to change, confirm activities each year on-line or in Annual Activities Packet.)

The projects information, the Bible Bowl questions and the book of the bible to be studied will be available on-line. The Annual Activities Packet will also show the bible book to be studied. Bible Bowl details, project definitions and Track Meet Rules are on the following pages. Sources for the questions asked during the Bowl will be the 50 qualifying questions and the book of the bible assigned each year. There will be a Bowl for Lads, Crusaders, and Challengers.

CONGRESS BIBLE & MISSION BOWL

The purpose of the Bible and Mission Bowl is to involve RA/Challengers in **Bible and Mission Study**.

Qualifications:

Upon registering, each Chapter will receive 50 qualifying questions that are to be answered and turned in at the on-site registration area on Saturday morning by 8:15 AM. Those qualifying questions are also listed on-line at www.ga-ra.org. The answers may be sought in any method available to the Chapter. The Chapter should be very familiar with the book of the Bible chosen for each year's bowl. (Check on-line at www.ga-ra.org, or in the Annual RA/Challenger Activities Packet for the bible book to be studied.) The sixteen (16) top qualifiers will compete in the Bible and Mission Bowl. There will be a Bible and Mission Bowl for Lads, Crusaders, and Challengers. In the event we have more than sixteen (16) top qualifiers, a question-answer run-off session will be held just prior to the Lad Event to determine the sixteen (16) participating chapters for Lads, Crusaders, and Challengers teams. In the event there are less than sixteen (16), teams will be divided as evenly as possible.

Bible and Mission Bowl Action:

A moderator will read the questions.

The first chapter to buzz in will get the opportunity to answer the question.

If a chapter buzzes in before the question is completely read, they must give an answer with only the information read so far.

If the first chapter to buzz in gives an incorrect answer, the remaining chapters may buzz in and answer the question.

If an incorrect answer is given, the question will be repeated in its entirety for the remaining chapters.

The chapters will have 10 seconds to answer the question.

If no chapter answers within 10 seconds, the question is void and another question will be read.

Sources for the questions will be the 50 qualifying questions and the book of the bible to be studied.

Scoring:

Each chapter will start out with four (4) points.

Each correct answer will add one (1) point to the chapter's total.

Each incorrect answer will subtract one (1) point from the chapter's total.

If a chapter loses all its points (score=0), that chapter is eliminated from competition.

The first chapter to score a total of eight (8) points wins the round.

Remaining chapters will continue to compete for remaining positions.

The first place winners in each round will compete in one final round. The first chapter to score a total of eight (8) points wins the bowl, and the remaining chapters will continue in the same manner to determine second, third, and fourth place.

- B. Chapter Advancement Projects
- C. Individual Campcraft Projects
- D. Chapter Campcraft Projects

II. Each Area Has Different Divisions:

- A. Lads
- B. Crusaders
- C. Challengers

III. A Definition of Each Area Follows:

- A. Individual Advancement Project
This is any project found in or inspired by Lad 1, Lad 2, Lad 3, Page, Squire, Knight, The Quest and The Journey. Projects from the RA *Leadership* magazine or annual *RA Planbook* may be entered as long as the project counts for advancement.
- B. Chapter Advancement Project
Any project found in or inspired by any advancement materials. This project is worked on by the Chapter.
- C. Individual Campcraft Project
Any project found in the *Brotherhood Campcraft Manual* or a Campcraft Workbook.
- D. Chapter Campcraft Project
Any project found in the *Brotherhood Campcraft Manual* or a Campcraft Workbook that is worked on by the Chapter.

IV. Award:

- A. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place awards will be awarded in all divisions.
- B. A participant award will be given to each boy and each Chapter that enters a project.

V. Registration:

- A. All projects are to be registered no later than 8:15 AM on Saturday of Fall Campout Congress.
- B. Fill out the registration form and turn it in with projects at the Registration Desk on Saturday.

Track Meet Is Open To All Boys Registered and Attending Fall Campout Congress.

Date and Time: RA/Challengers Track Meet is in **November**, along with Congress events.

Registration: No pre-registration for Track Meet Required. Register at Camp Kaleo office during Fall Campout Congress.

Note: Insurance requirements for Track Meet chaperones apply the same as for other Congress events. See **Child Protection Form and Minor Photo Release Form** at www.ga-ra.org or in the Annual RA/Challengers Activities Packet published by Men's Ministries.

Details:

The RA/Challengers Track Meet is held as part of the RA/Challengers Congress activities. The event is held in two-hour segments for each age group. The events and age groups are listed below. Since there is no paved track at Camp Kaleo, the races are held on the field, across the dam, or in the wooded areas.

Rules:

The Track Meet is open to all boys attending the Fall Campout Congress. The purpose of the meet is to promote fun, fellowship, and friendly competition among the boys. You do not have to have a team or particular number of boys. Any size group or even individuals may compete. Advance preparation or equipment is not required to participate.

Age groups are as follows:

Lads:	6 year olds	7 years olds	8 year olds
Crusaders:	9 year olds	10 year olds	11 year olds
Challengers:	12-13 year olds	14-15 year olds	16-17 year olds

Boys may enter all events in their age group.

Boys will participate in the group determined by their age, except in the Shuttle Relay events.

The Shuttle Relay is a short race with a team of four boys. Two boys are stationed on each side of the field and relay a baton back and forth across the field. In the Shuttle Relay event, there are only three races. All Lad boys run together in this race, all Crusaders run together, and so do all Challengers.

Boys must wear shirts, shorts, and rubber soled shoes. No cleats, spikes, or bare feet.

Medals will be presented to the first, second and third place winners in each event. Other special awards may also be given, so that each boy gets at least one award.

Officials will be volunteers from participating churches. At least twenty people are needed to officiate the meet. If you, or other adults coming with you, are willing to help, please contact the Track Meet Activity Coordinator. (For contact information, see on-line at www.ga-ra.org.)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Time is critical. In order to complete all of the events in two hours, we are going to have to move fast! We will start on time and keep things moving! Boys should warm up before coming to the field.
2. Boys must stay with their age group. There will be a group leader to escort them from event to event. A whistle will signal the time changes.
3. Boys will generally compete according to their age.
4. Medals will be given to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners. Special medals will also be given, so that every boy should receive at least one medal.
5. This is a fun event! We will try to keep the rules relaxed, but consistent.
